

Edit correction Guide

You try to make the correction first—when you have done your part, then you can ask a neighbor. Remember your neighbor is trying to problem solve on his or her own as well — don't use a lot of his or her time.

WW = wrong word (You have used the wrong word for what you are intending to say)
Suggestion: Re-look it up in the dictionary or look in the vocabulary for a different word for what you are intending.

WT = wrong tense (You have the correct infinitive, but you have the wrong tense)
Suggestion: Look up in your notes or your textbook to help you with the tenses you are using.

VC= verb conjugation (You have the correct infinitive and the right tense, but you have made an error with your conjugation).
Suggestion: Look in your book's appendix or in your notes (verb chart) to find the correct conjugation. Make sure you are matching the subject.

WO= word order (You have your words in the wrong order)
Suggestion: Are you doing a possessive- is it the adjective in the wrong place- are you writing a question – look in your grammar notes to help you with the answer.

^ = missing word (You are missing a word that is necessary in the sentence)
Suggestion: personal a, definite or indefinite article, subject

X = delete the word (Take the word out of the sentence—it is not needed)
Suggestion: Take out the word

AJ= adjective agreement (You are having issues with gender and/ or number agreement in your writing)
Suggestion: look to the noun-does it agree, do you have plurals, singulars, masculine and feminine

Circle around the word= spelling (You have spelled the word wrong—remember accents are spelling mistakes)
Suggestion: Look the word up.

?= I have no clue what you are trying to say or your intended meaning.
Suggestion: Try to rewrite the sentence or phrase using more simplistic words or with words you can control.
